Family Connection

Provide your children with a list of things that they are responsible for interspersed with things that they like to do—for example, make their beds, take out the garbage, go to the park, do homework, watch television, have a snack, feed the cat. The list should reflect their responsibilities and favourite recreations. Tell them to pretend that company is coming and ask which of the things listed should be done first. Explain that this is called setting priorities.

Ask them what Jesus says is the most important thing for them to do. Jesus tells us that the number-one priority is to follow him. But just as it is not always easy to do the things we are supposed to do before doing the fun things, it is not always easy to be a follower of Jesus. Yet when we put Jesus first, we will be truly happy.

If for some reason your child will not be returning to St Francis in 2017, a note stating their last day at our school and the school they will be attending is required.

INFANTS SPORTS CARNIVAL

On Tuesday 13th September we will be having our annual Infants Sports Carnival. Parents are welcome to attend and watch their children compete. The



carnival will be held at Glendenning Reserve from 9.30am to 12.30pm. Children will need to bring their recess to school with them on the day as they will be taking it down to the reserve. STUDENT SUPERVISION

Just a reminder - student supervision commences at 8:30am when the teacher rostered to do morning playground supervision goes on duty. Adequate supervision of students is provided at this time. Direct supervision of students that arrive before 8:30am is not provided and students are asked to sit and wait outside the canteen area until the duty teacher arrives.

It is recommended that parents do not drop off their students at school before 8:30 am. Before School care is available as an alternative.

OUTAGE MONDAY 12TH SEPTEMBER

Due to upgrades within the school our Internet and telephone lines will be down all day on Monday 12th September. We are hoping to have one phone line for incoming calls being diverted to a mobile for urgent calls. SICK BEFORE SCHOOL

Parents if your child is sick in the morning before coming to school, please do not send them. It is much better that they are resting and recuperating at home than in Sick Bay.



Once they return to school you please supply a letter to your child's teacher stating the reason for their absence.

SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY AND EXPECTATIONS

Thank you to the families who ensure that the students are wearing their full school uniform and are neatly groomed each day.

A reminder that:

Long hair must be tied back and extreme hairstyles are not acceptable. Streaks, lines and hair colouring are considered inappropriate for primary school children.

Sports shoes must be predominantly white with white laces not coloured. Fluoro coloured shoes are not appropriate.

We feel it is important at a young age to develop a pride in appearance and the concept of appropriateness of dress and appearance to suit the occasion.

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES - NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care.

It is now a requirement that all volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools. This undertaking also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.
