

HOW MANY TENS?

Place value is a challenging concept for many children to fully understand. They may be able to order numbers, read numbers and write numbers but do they understand the value of each digit?

How many tens are there in 394? Most would say there are 9 tens. Can you see how there are 39 tens in 394? What about 7286? There are 728 tens in 7286.

Many children get stuck when asked what is ten more than 394? If we know there are 39 tens in 394 and then add 1 more ten then we would have 40 tens or 404. Challenge your child to tell you how many tens are in a number.
