The Feast of The Assumption - This Saturday 15th August

Through the celebration of the Feast of the Assumption, we can reflect on the role our Blessed Mother Mary has in the mystery of our salvation. We firmly believe that Mary was free of all sin. Amen.


WOULD YOU LIKE TO HELP YOUR CHILD READ?

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WHY DO WE NUMBER BUST?

Number Busting is a valuable activity from Kindergarten upwards. In Kindergarten it will usually begin with children using materials. Later on, the task becomes more complex by adapting the number that children are asked to 'bust'. Some high schools have even had children *algebra* busting.



Number busting involves the students using hard thinking to partition numbers. Hard thinking requires the students to be challenged. If they record simple facts they already know then they aren't learning. How would you number bust these numbers? Below are some examples.

 $73 = 14x5+3 1\frac{1}{2} = \frac{3}{4} \times 2 12 = 3 + 4 + 5$

Try some number busting at home.
