As we approach the Third Sunday of Lent, Luke's Gospel (Lk 9:28-36) reminds us to listen to Jesus. In fact, God declares it. In this well-known account of the Transfiguration of the Lord, Jesus has a direct experience of God's Presence. The disciples present: Peter, John and James, witnessed this encounter, even though they were weighed down with sleep. However, this time they do not fall asleep, instead they are witness to what occurs and are engulfed by the cloud in which God declares Jesus is His son, the Chosen, and that we are to 'Listen to Him'.

It is our task now to 'listen to Him'; words which mean, "incline the ear of your heart and listen to the Lord who speaks in multitudinous ways and situations". This is real listening. It runs against the culture of mobile phones, and all the other technological gadgets that compete for our attention all day every day. It is a challenge to really listen to someone who wants to be heard. And therefore it is a challenge to listen to the Lord speaking to us in our daily life: through the Scriptures, in the Liturgy of the Mass, the Liturgy of the Hours, in my Brothers and Sisters and their joys and sorrows.

This does not mean that we have to wait for God to surprise us, as he surprised the three disciples. We can put ourselves in a position where we can open our eyes and change our perspective. Take some time this week to slow down and look for God's presence. Maybe you could take a walk and immerse yourself in the beauty of nature, or visit a church and sit before the Blessed Sacrament. Or just close your eyes, and picture Jesus sitting next to you. No matter how you do it, know that the Lord is near you. Nothing makes Him happier than when one of His children "wakes up"!

Pray... "Holy Spirit, I am sleepy. Wake me up to God's presence. I want to be fully in touch with you today."

COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

At St Francis our staff work hard to ensure that we are catering for each students needs, abilities and interests. There are also many ways in which families can support their children to be prepared for learning at school each day. One important way is making school attendance a high priority in your family. It is essential that each student is at school on time and prepared for school to take advantage of every learning opportunity. Children who are at school on time settle into routines very effectively and become confident and in control of their day ahead. Some children can become anxious and stressed when they have missed the regular morning routines.

If your child is absent they must produce a note written by the parent / caregiver and signed by the parent / caregiver. You have seven days to produce the note or the absence or lateness will be formally recorded as unexplained. You may not be aware that when a student is late to school, a 'partial absence' is recorded on the roll. The class roll is a legal document and is monitored within the school and regularly audited by external agencies.

There are times that students will be sick and cannot attend school. This is understood. Ongoing lateness, however, and unexplained absenteeism places the students learning and wellbeing at risk. Our team of teachers support all students who are absent in various ways.

Legislation requires that if you have a planned absence, a written application must be lodged with the Principal before your child/ren are absent from school. With a change of legislation, there is more paper work that must be completed for absence. Families are discouraged from having family holidays during term time.

Please be aware that this communication is to promote wellbeing for all students and a culture of high expectations and success for all.
