APPOINTMENT OF NEW BISHOP OF PARRAMATTA DIOCESE

His Holiness Pope Francis has appointed the Most Reverend Vincent Long Van Nguyen O.F.M. Conv. DD, as the fourth Bishop of the Diocese of Parramatta.

Bishop Long Van Nguyen comes to the Diocese with a rich understanding of the challenges and opportunities of multiculturalism in Western Sydney.

The new Bishop of Parramatta was born in 1961 in GiaKiem, Vietnam. In 1972, he joined the diocesan minor seminary which was later disbanded by the communist Government. In 1980 he left Vietnam to begin a new life in Australia.

After his ordination to the priesthood on 30 December 1989, Bishop Long went to Rome for further studies.

He was elected Superior of Conventual Franciscans in Australia in 2005 and appointed as Assistant General of the same Order and transferred to Rome in 2008. Bishop Long was appointed an Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Melbourne on 20 May 2011.

'I feel a sense of responsibility and honour to be appointed to the Diocese of Parramatta. I accepted the appointment by Pope Francis with humility,' Bishop Long said following the announcement.

'This appointment comes with great care for the people of Parramatta and for the Church locally,' he said. 'My immediate priority is to get to know the clergy and the people across the diocese.'

Executive Director of Schools Greg Whitby warmly welcomed Bishop Long to the Diocese.

'Bishop Long's diverse life experiences will enrich the Western Sydney community,' Greg said. 'He is familiar with our Diocese, having been parish priest at Our Lady of the Rosary at Kellyville in 1998-2002.'

'I'm sure everyone of our Catholic schools are looking forward to getting to know our new Bishop and to share with him the good work they do as part of the Mission of the Church,' he said.

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DID YOU KNOW?

Over the past fourteen months there have been many changes to St Francis school to improve the aesthetics, safety, teaching and learning for all the children, staff and parents. The following is a list of some of these improvements:

- Astro Turf
- Trees removed due to safety reasons
- Timber seating replaced by aluminium seating
- Soccer nets purchased
- Pavers levelled
- New carpet tiles installed in grades 1, 2 and 3
- Painting of the outside buildings and garden beds
- Playground line markings
- Thousands of dollars have been on spent purchasing good literature
- Approximately 50 chrome books purchased for grades 5 and 6
- 23 new iPads for infants classes
- Each grade has an Apple TV to support the teaching and learning
- CEDP organised replacement of all the fibre cable to the school to improve the efficiency and speed of the internet
- Signage currently being organised for hall facing Richmond Road
- 4 new air conditioners in grades 1, 5 and 6
- Currently the administration building is undergoing a refurbishment of recarpeting, painting and improvements to the functionality of the building
- Greening Australia have planted 1000 plants in the school so far this term with a further 1000 plants to come
- A trampoline is currently being erected for students use
