## ***Welcome to Term 2 – 2016***

I hope your family enjoyed the change of routine over the holiday break. The children certainly needed a rest after a hectic first term of learning.

This second term promises to be full of activity, rewarding learning and an exciting time lies ahead for the children as they engage in new units of work, be involved in community celebrations (e.g. Mother's Day), compete in the Athletics Carnival, Years 3 and 5 will be completing Naplan and more. We hope the quality of learning and the variety of experiences will ensure your child and our community are maximising the learning opportunities here at St Francis. Enjoy the Journey!

This Sunday we again look to the holy Gospel according to John ([John 14: 23-29](#)). This Scripture takes place just a few days before Jesus is put to death. The disciples are in a room with Jesus and telling him that they wouldn't know what to do if he left them.

This sounds a little unusual, doesn't it? Why would grown men be worried about Jesus not being with them anymore? I could understand if they were children, as they would have reason for being upset. Children need their adults: a parent or a grown up. But these disciples were the grownups!

Perhaps one of the things the disciples were worried about was that they might mess up! In the scriptures we can see that they didn't always understand what Jesus wanted. Like the time Jesus told them that children were important because they had the right trust in God, but then only a few days later the disciples tried to stop the children from coming to him, saying he (Jesus) was too busy to spend time with them. They acted as if the children were not at all important to Jesus, what were they thinking?

This was not the only time the disciples did not listen to Jesus, or thought they knew better. So why now were they worried about the prospect of being without Jesus? Maybe they were worried that without Jesus there would be no one to straighten them out if and when they 'messed up'.

I think that a concern they may have had was that without Jesus they may no longer feel close to God. With Jesus around, they always felt close to God. But without him they would feel alone. We saw how difficult it was for the disciples to do the right thing with Jesus around, how would they do it without Jesus? Would they not feel that God was with them?

Lucky for the disciples (and us!) Jesus said something that really got their attention! He told them they would not be alone after he was to leave them. Jesus told them that they would still have someone to teach, guide and help them. Who could this be? Jesus called it the "Holy Spirit". The Holy Spirit is another way we talk about God. The name Holy Spirit means God with us now. It is God that we feel in our hearts when we feel close to God—that's the Holy Spirit. It is God helping us to be brave when we want to stop a child from being mean to another child. That is the Holy Spirit.

Even though the disciples would no longer be able to see Jesus, they would have the Holy Spirit to teach them and help them. They would not be alone. The Holy Spirit is God with us now. The Holy Spirit was with the first disciples, and the Holy Spirit is with us. We are not alone and the church is not alone. God, the Holy Spirit, is with us!

## OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY SERVICES FOR CHILDREN

Sharon Duff & Louise Duff

Occupational Therapists

Louise and Sharon are Occupational Therapists in private practice and have over 20 years experience working with children who have motor, coordination, attention and handwriting difficulties.

They will be working from St Francis of Assisi and are able to conduct school based assessment and therapy sessions. The sessions are paid for by the child's family. Those with private health insurance may be eligible to claim some of the expenses. Some families may also be eligible to claim a limited number of sessions through Medicare (but this would need to be discussed with their GP). Sessions may also be conducted at consulting rooms if preferred.

Louise and Sharon work with the following types of problems:

- ◆ Handwriting difficulties for example
  - poor legibility and speed of writing
  - difficulty organising & planning writing problematic pencil grip
  - pain and limited endurance when writing
  - poor motivation or performance for writing tasks
  - reduced confidence with written work
- ◆ Fine motor difficulties including
  - Cutting, colouring, drawing
  - Manipulating objects such as buttons and laces
  - Attention difficulties
