CUTTING EDGE TECHNOLOGY TRANSPORTING STUDENTS OVERSEAS

The immersive experience by Catholic charity Mary follows nine-year-old Maia as she heads back to school in her East Timorese community and gives students a glimpse into her way of life.

Teacher Chris Boyer said students were fascinated to explore a typical school day in a country they had been closely connected to through fundraising.

"We hear lots of stories about East Timor, but to see it in a virtual, 3D model, made it more powerful for the kids," Mr Boyer said. "We've been working closely with the East Timorese for a long time, so the students are

definitely passionate about the culture and really want

"Since there's a visual, it's easy for the young kids to compare their lives and leads to a lot of discussion and drives their passion to help even more."

Mr Boyer said the technology was revolutionary in allowing students to see some of the struggles East Timorese children face each day.

CHANGING GOING HOME ARRANGEMENTS

A reminder to parents that our official school day is from 8:55 am until 3:00pm, and that your child is required to be present between these times. Children should not be taken out of school early unless it is for an important reason (ie. Appointment for specialists etc.) Likewise, any changes of going home arrangements should only be made in cases of emergencies. As you can appreciate, contacting classes for children to come to the office for early departures or to advise going home changes is disruptive to the learning, in particular, to the whole school if the class is not in their room and an announcement needs to be made. Please note children will only be called to the office when you arrive to collect them. We ask that you do not contact the office requesting your children be ready and waiting for your arrival as delays in traffic etc. may result in children waiting for long periods. We thank you for your support in this matter.

WHY IS MY CHILD'S TEACHER OUT OF CLASS?

Like professionals in other fields, all teachers are required to keep up to date with current thinking on best practices and new developments in all curriculum areas. From time to time teachers are required to attend professional learning opportunities to learn about changes to curriculum, new methods of teaching & learning and other ways of integrating technology. These sessions sometimes occur during the day, after school or in the school holidays. Teachers are also given time at the beginning of the year to conduct assessments to pinpoint your child's learning needs. Some teachers also have additional responsibilities which benefit the whole school. At times, teachers are also required at diocesan events etc. Teachers also have entitlements such as sick leave, long service leave, maternity leave, bereavement leave, jury duty etc. Consequently there will be times when your child's teacher is absent from the classroom. On these days the teacher's program and day book is followed. Teachers on a grade work closely together allowing the grade partners to liaise with the casual teacher so that good teaching and learning continues and routines are kept. We thank you for your support in this area.


