PRIVACY

As a Catholic school, we have Jesus as our role model – we strive to be like him, but the nature of our humanity means that sometimes we make mistakes from which we are able to learn. Each day is a new day and a new beginning for everyone in our community.

As much as we all love our own children, it is important to accept that they will make mistakes along the way. They may blame others for something they have done so as not to get into trouble. They may exclude others from their games and conversations, thus causing another child to feel hurt. They may even make up stories about another child to get your attention. It is really important that you listen to what your child tells you and realise that there are always two sides to every story. Talk about it, and give them some positive strategies to be able to move on and allow them to develop their social skills by building resilience and practice solving problems by themselves.

Being part of a positive learning community which is based on Gospel values, allows us all to build and practice the skills of resilience, problem solving and respect for others.

Discussing any child other than your own with other parents, is never appropriate – you wouldn't want to find out that your child has been the topic of social media posts or judgemental gossip. As parents, it is important that we model forgiveness and acceptance.

Always remember that the classroom teachers are your first point of call with any issues which may need clarification or for any area of concern.
