### OCTOBER—THE MONTH OF THE ROSARY

October is a month particularly devoted to The Rosary. The Rosary is one of the most cherished prayers of Christian faith and has been prayed for hundreds of years. At its heart is a series of meditations on aspects, or mysteries, of the life of Jesus Christ and Mary his mother. The Joyful Mysteries reflect on the early infancy and childhood of Jesus. The Luminous Mysteries (or Mysteries of Light) follow events of Jesus' Ministry and Teachings. The Sorrowful Mysteries reflect on Jesus' suffering during the Passion. The Glorious Mysteries celebrate the events surrounding and following Christ's triumphant Resurrection.

October presents itself as an opportunity to focus on Mary in any family prayer. You could share the Hail Mary before meals or even a decade of the Rosary once a week. Taking a little prayer time, yourself individually during October could be a wonderful way to embrace the month and seek a little refocusing.



### **BUILDING UPDATE**

The latest information about the building plans for the new K-6 structure is that the demolition of the old Kindy, Year 1 and Year 2 buildings will happen in the middle of November this Year.

In preparation for this we have been slowly moving Grades into new learning spaces where they will stay for the remainder of the year. We have been very mindful to keep the learning happening which is why this took the whole term.

### **New Grade Locations**

Kindy - Old Library

Year 1 - Previous Year 3 space

Year 2 - Portable building in the middle of the playground

Year 3 - Portable building at the rear of the school (back carpark no longer used for parking)

Year 4 - Have remained in their learning space

Year 5 - School hall in purpose-built space for learning

Year 6 - School hall in purpose-built space for learning

Library - Relocated to the building alongside Year 2

### **KEEPING OUR CHILDREN SAFE ONLINE**

Recently there was a deeply distressing and harmful video circulating on social media. eSafety made immediate contact about the reports with the major social media companies. eSafety continues to work closely with the companies to prevent further uploads and sharing of harmful videos.

The National Suicide Prevention Adviser to the Prime Minister, Christine Morgan has urged all Australians to avoid viewing or sharing videos of this nature. Christine noted 'content which includes explicit descriptions, images or footage of suicide, especially where methods are shown, have been linked to increases in suicidal thoughts, suicide attempts and suicide deaths.'

While we understand that children can be enterprising and that word of the video may have gone viral in some classrooms and playgrounds, we also need to balance this phenomena with concerns around arousing curiosity to students who may not be aware of such a distressing online incident. This is particularly important with content that relates to suicide and self-harm."

If parents or carers encounter harmful and disturbing content online, report it immediately to the social media platform they've seen it on first, and then to eSafety at www.esafety.gov.au/report/illegal-harmful-content.

Children may feel scared, embarrassed, or confused about having seen inappropriate content, so it is important to communicate in an open and supportive manner that they need to inform their parents or teachers. Sometimes children fear that adults may not be able to help them or fear reprisals like 'device denial' if they do share harmful content they have been exposed to online, so it is important for them to know how responsible they are in reporting the content.

Parents are urged to do the following:

Engage in your child's online activities – ask what apps, sites and games they're using and make sure they're age appropriate.

Ensure that technology is charged in a family area at night. You can also try to make an agreement that there are no tablets, laptops or gaming in bedrooms.

Use parental controls on devices to help limit what your child is exposed to.

Help your child/children to report and block upsetting content they see on social media sites or apps.

Let your child/children know they can come to you about anything upsetting they see online.

If your child is a regular user of social networks, they must be aware of the risk of personal information or images being made public once they post it. While they won't fully understand the consequences of revealing personal information online, they need to be cautious and thoughtful about what they post and share. Encourage your children to ask themselves before posting anything if the information (i.e. name, phone number, home address, email, name of school) or photo is something they would give a stranger. If the answer is no, don't post it.

Every picture and personal detail that is posted and shared on social media and the internet contributes to someone's digital footprint. The big risk with this is that once information is shared publicly, it can be used in ways you may not expect and cannot control. You should also assume that anything that is put online is permanent (it can sometimes be deleted but not always before others have seen it and saved it).

Most apps, networks and devices have geo-tagging features which make your whereabouts public and can lead someone directly to you. These features should be turned off for obvious privacy and safety reasons. Digital photos also contain metadata (information about the time, date and GPS coordinates) which may reveal more than you want to. Some social media platforms automatically hide or remove this data, but not all, so do your homework and know how much information you're sharing.

Lead by example and always model the kind of positive online behaviour you would like your children to use. If they see you being cautious and respectable when you are online, they are more likely to follow in your footsteps. Ultimately, you don't want to instil fear in your child or prevent them from experiencing the many educational, entertainment, social and other benefits of the internet, but rather give them the skills and knowledge they need to know how to make the most of it and avoid the dangers.

The St Francis staff will continue to provide safety education to ensure that our students are safe online, and we will support our students to follow our school agreements in being safe and responsible using technology.

### YEARS 3 TO 6 JAPANESE DAY

### **Japanese Incursion Days**

On Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday this week, Years 3 - 6 participated in a Japanese Day Incursion. The students were involved in several activities;

- Sumie (calligraphy) art with a Japanese fude (brush) to paint a nezumi (mouse) and usagi (rabbit) with black ink.
- Shibori, which is folding paper in different ways and dying it with a variety of colours to make patterns.
- Hachimaki headband with a message in hiragana and kanji.
- Decorating hashi (chopsticks) with origami paper.
- For lunch students ate gohan (rice) and Japanese curry in an obentou box with miso soup, poki sticks, mochi, nori and some fresh fruit. Students ate their lunch using a pair of hashi.

Parents and carers, you should be immensely proud of your children for their use of manners on the day. Also, of their own volition, many students have approached myself and their teachers to express their gratitude for planning and running this day for them. Your children/s involvement and sincere appreciation made the days even more enjoyable.










### **SCHOOL PHOTOS**

### Notes:

- Completed registration form and copy of Baptism certificate must be submitted on this night. Name of contact person (parent/carer), email address and mobile number must be provided on the form.
- Before this day, please inform the Coordinator, Priscilla Corpuz if you
  are interested, by sending an email to <u>sacraments@tpg.com.au</u>. Please
  advise number of children you want to register. Do not email
  registration form.
- Only one parent/carer must attend as we are required to observe physical distancing. Children do not need to come.

# Confirmation classes: Venues to be advised: Attendance is a MUST:

18 Oct – First lesson @ 10am to 11am 25 Oct – Second lesson @ 10am to 11am 01 Nov – Third lesson @ 10am to 11am 08 Nov – Fourth lesson @ 10am to 11am

Note: The above dates fall on Sundays. Weekday sessions, after school, might become available depending on the number of registrations we received.

### Rehearsal with Sponsor:

14 Nov - Saturday @ 1:00- 4:00pm.

### Rite of Confirmation:

15 Nov - Sunday @ 2pm

**Note:** Once again, depending on the number of registrations, a 2nd batch of Rehearsal and Rite of Confirmation will be made available, being 21 Nov and 22 Nov, respectively.

# All children require a Sponsor:

Must be baptised, practicing catholic, 18 years and over. Godparents and siblings can be sponsors. All sponsors must be present during Rehearsal.

### Confirmation Name:

All children must choose a Saint's name as their Confirmation name. It is advisable for the children to know something about their chosen Saint. If your child is baptised with a Christian name, eg: Matthew, Mark or John, there is no need to choose another Saint's name.

### Age of Children:

Must be 10 years of age. Please note: if your child is over 10 years old and just received their 1<sup>st</sup> Holy Communion in 2020, Confirmation must be deferred to 2021

It is a requirement by the Diocese that children can receive One Sacrament per year.

### Fees:

Contribution of \$15 per child to cover lesson materials and certificate.
