Dear Parents and Carers,

Draft New Curriculum Living Life to the Full

The Rationale around our Draft New Curriculum 'Living Life to the Full', explains the 'why' of the curriculum.

Rationale

Education within the Diocese of Parramatta is a ministry of the Catholic Church, walking with humility in the way of Jesus Christ, serving all of God's people.

The aspiration of *Living Life to the Full* is to invite each student to discover a meaningful, hope-filled and flourishing life through an encounter with the teaching of the Christian Gospel and the traditions of the Catholic Church.

Responding to the signs of the times and inspired by the living Gospel, the Curriculum engages in dialogue and encounter which informs and develops an understanding of the inclusive mission of Jesus Christ.

The 'love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given to us' (Romans 5:5). This love was at the heart of the life of Jesus. Drawing upon the intellectual tradition of the Catholic Church and the witness of parents and teachers this curriculum seeks to communicate the love of God through prayer, reason and action within a dynamic of relationship and dialogue. Students are encouraged to become agents of their own experiential learning through inquiry and to grow in Christian maturity.

The Curriculum aspires to educate through the head, heart and hands in building intentional faith communities that promote, teach and exemplify an authentic way of being through inclusion and being 'places of evangelization, of complete formation, of inculturation, of apprenticeship in a lively dialogue between young people of different religions and social backgrounds' (Catholic Schools on the Threshold of the Third Millennium, 1997 n. 10).

Following the Way of Jesus who was totally attuned to the heart of God the Father and completely consumed by a passion for the world, *Living Life to the Full* seeks to awaken in young people the desire for personal and social transformation through intentional discipleship. It seeks to nurture a strong sense of inclusion, positive regard and belonging. Understanding that 'the word of God is alive and active' (Hebrews 4:12), a dynamic and diverse life of faith is fostered:

- A faith seeking understanding.
- A faith exemplified by Mary, the Mother of God, that understands each person is made in the image and likeness of God who is love (1 John 4:8).
- A faith that transforms into Christian service towards all, particularly the marginalised and the most vulnerable.

The Curriculum reflects Jesus' invitation to 'Come and see' (John 1:39) and to "Put out into the deep" (Luke 5: 4). Seeking to follow His example and inspired by an Incarnational Spirituality, the Curriculum invites students to discern God in all things 'since it is in God that we live, and move, and exist' (Acts 17:28).

In these ways, *Living Life to the Full* seeks to awaken a sacramental vision of reality, through proclaiming the living Gospel. With Pope Francis, Bishop Vincent and the whole faith community of the Parramatta Diocese, we strive to ensure that every young person is invited into experiences of *metanoia*: a joyful, blessed, transcendent and transformational education. Catholic education is understood as an invitation to human flourishing, one that liberates each person to 'have life and have it to the full' (John 10:10).

TECHNOLOGY

As a parent you have a responsibility to monitor your child's use of technology at home, in particular, over the holidays. As a school we speak regularly to our older grades about appropriate technology use.

Suggestions include:

- Viewing your child's text messages (both inbox & outbox)
- Viewing internet history
- Viewing emails sent and received
- Encouraging your child to block any children on social media if needed

- Setting up rules of usage and following through with restricted or no mobile phone, internet usage etc. for a period of time

- Monitoring games they play against others on the internet, particularly those that are age specified.

Congratulations to Joshua Lowe, Oliver Lowe and Ronin Bondal who managed to raise the highest amounts individually.



08 August – 1st lesson, 10:30am to 11:30am
15 August – 2nd lesson, 10:30am to 11:30am
22 August – 3rd lesson, 10:30am to 11:30am
29 August – 4th lesson, 10:30am to 11:30am
Note: If you have made other plans for the above dates, please defer.

Rehearsal with Sponsor:

04 Sep – Saturday, 1:00 - 4:00pm and possibly 11 Sep – Saturday, 1:00 – 4:00pm

<u>Rite of Confirmation:</u> 05 Sep – Sunday @ 2pm and possibly 12 Sep – Sunday @ 2pm

Note: The Confirmation dates are subject to change depending on the number of registrations and changes to NSW Health Restrictions.

All children require a Sponsor:

A sponsor must be baptised, practicing catholic, 18 years and over. Godparents and siblings can be sponsors. All sponsors must be present during Rehearsal.

Confirmation Name:

All children must choose a Saint's name as their Confirmation name. It is advisable for the children to know something about their chosen Saint. If your child is baptised with a Christian name, eg: Matthew, Mark or John, there is no need to choose another Saint's name.

Age of Children:

Must be 10 years of age.

Please note: if your child is over 10 years old and have just received their 1st Holy Communion in 2021, Confirmation must be deferred to 2022. It is a requirement by the Diocese that children can receive only One Sacrament per year.

Fees:

Contribution of \$15 per child to cover lesson materials and certificate.
